#### 1. Organising Authority

- 1.1 East Coast Sailing Week 2009 will be organised by The Royal Tay Yacht Club 34 Dundee Road, West Ferry, Dundee, DD5 1LX. Tel: 01382 477516.

#### 2. Rules

- 2.1 The series will be governed by the Racing Rules of Sailing (2009 – 2012), the prescriptions of the RYA, the rules of each class and this Notice of Race all as modified by the Sailing Instructions.
- 2.2 Should there be any changes to the Racing Rules these will be advised in the Sailing Instructions and may also be posted on the Official Notice Board at the Royal Tay Yacht Club.

#### 3. Advertising

- 3.1 The event will be Category C.

#### 4. Eligibility and Entry

- 4.1 The regatta is open to keel boats for handicap classes (3 classes), keel boats for Restricted Sail classes, Sports Boats for a Handicap Class and the Squib Class.
- 4.2 Yachts may enter by completing the attached form and sending it, together with the required fee to the Treasurer, at the address in 5.1, by 12<sup>th</sup> June 2009.
- 4.3 Late entries will be accepted at the discretion of the organising committee.

- 5.4 Free craning will be provided from 10.00hrs up to 14.00hrs on Saturday 4<sup>th</sup> July and from 16.30hrs on Friday 10<sup>th</sup> July. Craning will be at Broughty Ferry harbour.
- 5.5 Swinging moorings will be provided for all competing yachts and a ferry service will be run from approx 07.30hrs throughout the day with the last ferry at approx 23.30hrs. Yachts should retain the allocated mooring for the duration of the event.
- 5.6 The Race Committee reserve the right to cancel, combine or add classes and times of starts depending on the number of entries.

## 6. SCHEDULE

### 6.1 Registration

Registration will be at the Royal Tay Yacht Club main clubhouse from 12.00hrs to 16:00hrs on Saturday 4<sup>th</sup> July and Sunday 5<sup>th</sup> July 2009.

The briefing will be held in the Royal Tay Yacht Club main clubhouse at 19.30hrs on Sunday 5th July 2009. It is recommended that a representative of each yacht attend.

Squib and Sports Boat class will have an 8 race series. Restricted Sail and Keel Classes will have no series race on Thursday and hence a 7 race series.

### 6.3 Feeder races will be arranged by Forth Yacht Clubs Association and North East Racing.

## 7. MEASUREMENTS & RATINGS

### 7.1 Sports Boats shall produce a valid measurement/rating certificate and this rating will apply for all races.

### 7.2 Yachts in the Handicap Classes will be allocated a handicap based on the RTYC handicap system, based on the Portsmouth Yardstick, with input from Forth Yacht Clubs Association and North East Racing.

### 7.3 Yachts in the Restricted Sail class can enter the Duke of Edinburgh Trophy using full sails and will be handicapped accordingly for this race.

## **8. SAILING INSTRUCTIONS**

The sailing instructions will be available on the web site [www.royaltay.org](http://www.royaltay.org) from 1<sup>st</sup> May 2009 and mailed to competitors on receipt of entry form and payment. For entries received after 15<sup>th</sup> June 2009 the instructions will be issued at registration.

## **9. VENUE**

9.1 The event will be based at the Royal Tay Yacht Club, Grassy Beach, West Ferry, Dundee.

9.2 The racing areas will be as follows:

The Tay Estuary from west of the Rail Bridge to the Inner Buoys

The Duke of Edinburgh Trophy will, if possible, include the Bell Rock Lighthouse in the course.

## **10. THE COURSES**

The courses will be as follows:

All Classes Sunday, Monday Race 1, Tuesday, Wednesday – Round the buoys.

All Classes Monday Race 2 – The Bridges Race

Thursday Offshore Race – Course may include the Bell Rock Lighthouse

Thursday Squib & Sports Boats – Round the buoys

All Classes Friday – Estuary Inshore

## **11. SCORING**

11.1 The scoring system will be the RYA Low Points System per Appendix A.

11.2 4 races are required to be completed to constitute a series.

11.3 When more than 4 races are completed there will be one discard allowed for the calculation of the yachts series score

## **12. EQUIPMENT REGULATIONS**

Yachts shall comply with the Safety Code for Keel Boats Including Dayboats – Appendix 1.

### 13. PRIZES

13.1 Prizes will be given as follows:

- Individual race prizes for all classes
- The Duke of Edinburgh Trophy for the winner of the all classes handicap offshore race
- Overall prizes for all classes
- The Tennents Trophy for the “Boat of the Week”
- “Dick of the Day” and an overall “Dick of the Week”

13.2 The overall prize giving will be at the Royal Tay Yacht Club main clubhouse at 19.00hrs on Friday 10 July.

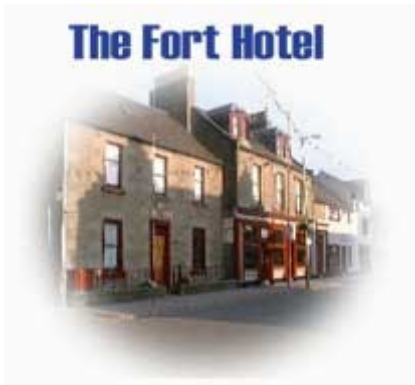
### 17. SOCIAL PROGRAMME & MEALS

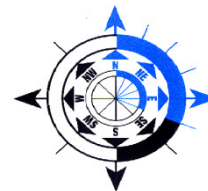

## APPENDIX 1

### SAFETY CODE FOR KEEL BOATS INCLUDING DAYBOATS.

The following equipment will be properly functioning, in date and be of a size and type suitable and adequate for the intended use and size of the yacht. Each yacht will be liable to inspection by members of the Race Committee.

#### Equipment to be carried in all races

- a) Anchor, chain and warp of designed weight for yacht
- b) Steering compass
- c) Leadline or echo sounder
- d) Fire extinguisher (if engine carried)
- e) Flares: minimum 2 hand (red), 2 hand smoke (orange).  
or suitable alternative, Very pistol or pack of mini flares.
- f) First aid kit
- g) Fog horn
- h) Lifejackets and waterproof clothing for all crew
- i) Bucket on line
- j) Torch
- k) Bilge pump
- l) Clock or watch
- m) Engine or paddle
- n) Heaving line of 4 - 5 fathoms (7.5 – 9.5 metres)
- o) Spares and tool kit

#### Additional Equipment for Duke of Edinburgh Trophy Race

- a) Kedge anchor with a minimum of 3 fathoms ( 5.5 metres ) of chain and suitable warp
- b) Hand bearing compass
- c) Charts (for area to be sailed) and instruments
- d) Radio capable of receiving weather bulletins
- e) Navigation lights
- f) Radar reflector
- g) Second fire extinguisher
- h) Lifebuoy with self igniting light and 100 ft ( 33 metres ) of floating line
- i) 33 metres of floating line
- j) 2 parachute flares: 1 hand (red), 1 hand (white)
- k) Liferaft or rubber dinghy and pump
- l) Engine: either inboard or outboard
- m) Safety harnesses for all crew
- n) Suitable attached points for safety harnesses
- o) VHF radio transmitter/receiver
- p) Soft wood plugs to be attached or adjacent to appropriate fittings.

**Yachts competing in Feeder Races and the Duke of Edinburgh Trophy Race are required to be registered with the Coastguard on form CG 66.**
